

Arkansas has the second-highest rate of opioid prescriptions in the nation, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. This trend has severely affected the health of entire communities, with counties like Stone, Sharp, Baxter, Fulton and Izard being among the most affected by opioid and substance abuse related death in the state.

As a result, funded by USDA, Winrock International, with Ozarka College and UAMS will implement the UPSOAR project to deliver opioid and substance abuse training, education and awareness to Stone, Sharp, Izard, Fulton, and Baxter counties in Arkansas.

UPSOAR will deliver free, interactive trainings to adults and youth and will provide ready-made tools that will be available online for further education. These will include:



Live, in-person trainings for adults



Risk-free simulation trainings to help participants identify signs of and respond to an overdose.



Youth-specific, in-person trainings in local schools.



Educational videos on opioid and substance abuse.



Interactive,
educational
modules to be
used by educators,
employers or
general public.



Referrals services to participants who may need treatment or counseling for opioid or substance abuse problems.

- increasing confidence in identifying and reacting to opioid and substance abuse overdose, and
